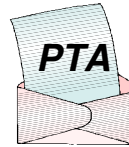

KEEP YOUR FAMILY ON TRACK. GET VACCINATED AGAINST THE FLU

Many households at this time of the year are a whirlwind of after-school activities, sleepovers, field trips and visits to the grocery store. Managing such a busy schedule is no easy task and can seem even more difficult if someone in your house gets the flu. That's why it's important that you consider having your entire household vaccinated against influenza every year. And this year we have two flus to be concerned about- seasonal and H1N1 (swine flu).

Now is the time to protect your family with both a seasonal influenza and H1N1 vaccination. You can make an appointment with your health-care provider, or take advantage of the H1N1 vaccine (but not seasonal) program that the Pinellas County Department of Health will be offering in schools in November and December for students of all ages.

The school vaccine program will be **voluntary** and require a **signed consent** form as well as a completed screening questionnaire by the parent so the health department can determine the appropriate vaccine. Both the **H1N1 flu shot and H1N1 flu nasal spray will be offered free to all children enrolled in public schools**. There is information posted on the Pinellas County Schools website-including school vaccine schedules and Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ).

Don't delay. More than 4 out of 5 people in the U.S. are recommended to get a seasonal flu shot, including those with chronic medical conditions; children between the ages of 6 months and 18 years; and close contacts of anyone in these groups, including parents. Chances are we all know someone who should get vaccinated against influenza every year.

Influenza is not the common cold. It's serious. Each year, approximately 226,000 people in the U.S. are hospitalized with complications from influenza and an average of 36,000 people die. And we are right now in the midst of an H1N1 pandemic, which seems to be targeting children and young adults. And even though most cases recover in 5-7 days, there have been deaths also reported from this flu.

To help encourage local immunization, The American Lung Association in Florida Gulfcoast Area is teaming up with local community schools, businesses, hospitals and city government to bring the *Faces of Influenza* educational initiative to the Tampa/St. Petersburg area. The program is designed to help Americans see themselves and their loved ones among the many "faces" of influenza.

Vaccination is the best protection available against seasonal and H1N1 influenza. Art in the News Administration Building Art Exhibition

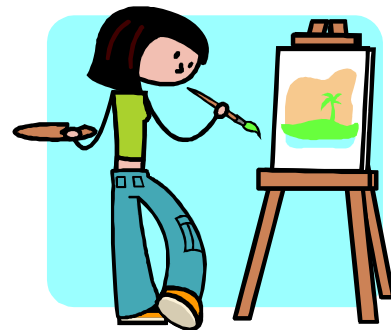

Parents,

Our physical education department will be testing your child in the five health components of fitness. We will be striving to help students understand the health components of fitness, how to assess them and then how to use their personal information to develop a lifelong fitness program that they enjoy.

Pinellas County uses the Fitnessgram testing protocol. Fitnessgram tests the five health components of fitness which are: aerobic capacity, body composition, muscular strength, muscular endurance and flexibility.

- Aerobic capacity / cardiovascular endurance tests include the Mile run, Pacer test and Walk test.**

- Body composition is determined by either skin fold measurements or Body Mass Index. The BMI is a calculation of the ratio of weight to height. Most of our schools will use this method. Weighing and measuring will be done discreetly during class.**

- Muscular endurance is measured by using the curl up which measures abdominal strength and endurance and the trunk lift which measures strength, endurance and flexibility.**

- Muscular strength is tested by push ups, modified pull ups, pull ups and the flex arm hang.**

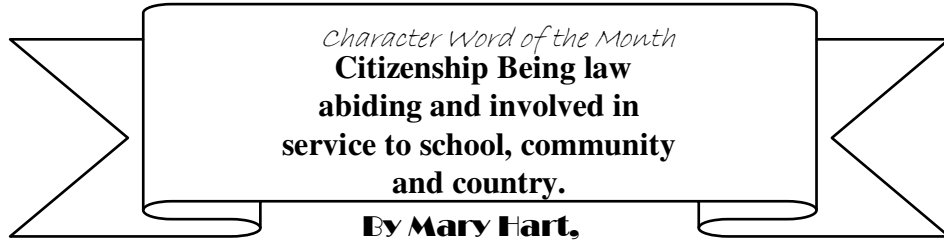
- Flexibility is measured by the sit and reach test and the shoulder stretch.**

Each test measures minimal fitness and compares the students score to the healthy fitness zone for their age and gender. The test also gives the students pointers on how to either improve or maintain their fitness level. It is our goal to help students make good choices in their fitness activities so that they can live a long, healthy life. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact your child's physical education teacher.

You, as a family, are encouraged to discuss a separate ‘situation’ each week of the month, presented as a “Dinner Dilemma”. You could decide how the character quality relates to the situation presented. Additionally, you could discuss how the character quality of the month applies to each family member. The character word for the month of November is **Citizenship**.

<p>Week 1 Situation: Sam’s class goes to lunch. When they sit down there is a mess under the table left from the previous class. The cafeteria monitor comes by and asks Sam to clean up the mess. Dilemma: On one hand Sam knows being a good citizen means keeping the school clean and safe. On the other hand Sam knows his class did not make the mess. Discussion: What advice do you have for Sam?</p>	<p>Week 2 Situation: Sue, wanting to be a good citizen, was moving the neighbor’s trash can back to her garage. The neighbor yelled at her, “Don’t step on my flowers!” Dilemma: On one hand Sue wants to be a good citizen by helping a neighbor. On the other hand her neighbor never says, “Thank you,” and often yells at her. Discussion: What advice do you have for Sue?</p>
<p>Week 3 Situation: Sam’s class votes on a service learning project that Sam does not like, did not vote for, and does not want to do. Dilemma: On one hand Sam knows as a good citizen the majority rules. On the other hand Sam does not want to participate in the project he did not vote for. Discussion: What advice do you have for Sam?</p>	<p>Week 4 Situation: Sue was chosen to be a safety patrol because she is a good citizen. She sees her best friend running down the hall. Dilemma: On one hand Sue knows she should write a referral on her friend. On the other hand Sue does not want to get her best friend in trouble. Discussion: What advice do you have for Sue?</p>
