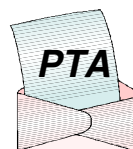

I am SPIKE! I am the mascot for the reading program at Oakhurst Elementary School. My name stands for Students and Parents Involved in Kid's Education.

Your PTA is proud to once again sponsor this program for you. My job is to encourage you to read as often possible.

Here's how the program works:

- Each month you will receive a SPIKE calendar.
- Every day that you read for at least twenty minutes, have an adult family member initial that date on your calendar.
- The first week of each new month, you will turn in your completed calendar with twenty minutes for twenty days to your teacher (signed by your parent or guardian.)
- To help you track your progress at home, I'd like to give you a bookmark. After you turn in your calendar, you may mark your accomplishments with a sticker next to the corresponding month. This is to celebrate with your family and I won't need it back.

A PTA Sponsored Program

Mustang Publishing is a program, sponsored by PTA, that gives the children at Oakhurst the opportunity to publish their writing. Each student is able to receive one published book per school year. The book can be a short story, a collection of poems or even works of non-fiction. This is a great program that combines the hard work of our teachers, parents and students!

Our process to make the books involves several steps. Volunteers are so important to the success of this program. **Currently, we are in need of a chairperson to head up this amazing program.** Without a chairperson, this program will not be available this year.

In addition, there are various opportunities to get involved within the committee and they are explained in more detail below:

❖Volunteers who can pre-make book covers needed!

If you can iron, this is the place for you. We need volunteers who can iron fabric onto ¼' cardboard to make the covers for the students.

❖ Volunteers who can type and scan books needed!

If you have a computer and scanner, we need you. We need volunteers that can type text and scan illustrations for each book. A very easy to use computer program is provided by PTA for this process.

❖Volunteers to bind the printed pages into the chosen cover needed!

If you know how to sew, please let us know. We need volunteers that could sew the printed pages of the books into their chosen cover. It is a simple stitch straight up the middle of the book and a little more glue to hold it all in.

You, as a family, are encouraged to discuss a separate ‘situation’ each week of the month, presented as a “Dinner Dilemma”. You could decide how the character quality relates to the situation presented. Additionally, you could discuss how the character quality of the month applies to each family member. The character word for the month of September is **“Responsibility”**

Week 1

Situation: Sam received an expensive video game for his birthday and could not wait to show it to his friends. One of his friends wanted to borrow it.

Dilemma: On one hand it’s good to share. On the other hand it is Sam’s responsibility to take care of his possessions.

Discussion: What advice do you have for Sam?

Week 2

Situation: Sue heard her friends spreading an untrue rumor about another girl in her class.

Dilemma: On one hand it’s responsible to inform someone when others are saying untrue or hurtful things. On the other hand a responsible person does not spread rumors and should tell people who do that it is wrong.

Discussion: What advice do you have for Sue?

Week 3

Situation: Sue is on a team that is doing a research project on water conservation. Sue feels she is doing most of the work.

Dilemma: On one hand Sue has the responsibility to make sure her team makes a good grade. On the other hand it is not Sue’s responsibility to do all the work.

Discussion: What advice do you have for Sue?

Week 4

Situation: Sam saw a sibling taking money out of his mother’s purse.

Dilemma: On one hand Sam has the responsibility not to get his sibling in trouble by telling. On the other hand Sam has the responsibility to tell his mother.

Discussion: What advice do you have for Sam?
